

ELECTION VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

The City of Omro is always looking for Election Inspectors to enhance democracy by ensuring the integrity of the electoral process at the polls. Qualified Election Inspectors must be residents of Winnebago County and attend a minimum of six hours of paid training to be certified to work at the polls. Six additional hours of training every two years is required to maintain certification. The City of Omro will provide the necessary training.

Election Inspectors play a vital role at polling locations. The experiences gained at the polls can be highly rewarding, challenging, interesting and personally satisfying. Many of the City's Election Inspectors have worked in these positions for more than 15-20 years and find it is a great way to achieve a feeling of community. Please consider employment as an Election Inspector. Your community support will help the city uphold the integrity of our elections. The City of Omro polling location for all districts is located at the Omro Area Community Center at 130 W. Larrabee Street.

Please contact City Clerk Barbara Van Clake to be considered for the Election Inspector position. Contact (920) 685-7000 for more information on how you can become a patriotic part of the process for upholding our democracy on the front lines.

VOTER REGISTRATION REQUIRED

By mail, up to 20 days before the election. Registration forms should be mailed to the municipal clerk. You can start the voter registration form online at myvote.wi.gov. The form must be printed, signed, and mailed or delivered, to the municipal clerk. You must provide a Proof of Residence document when registering. If you are registering by mail, use any of the forms of Proof of Residence except a residential lease.

Online, up to 20 days before the election. Voters who have a valid State of Wisconsin Driver License or State of Wisconsin ID card issued by the Wisconsin Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) can register to vote online on the MyVote Wisconsin website: <http://myvote.wi.gov>. To register online, you must enter a name, date of birth, Driver License or ID number and address that matches what is on file with the Wisconsin DMV. If all of the fields match, you

will be able to register to vote completely online without needing to print, sign or mail the form and without needing to send a proof of residence document. Voters who are not able to match their information with the information in the DMV database will be given the option to register by mail (see mail instructions).

In the municipal clerk's office, you may register in-person in the up until the Friday before the election at 5 pm, or close of business, whichever is later. You must provide a Proof of Residence document when registering to vote. You may register at the polls on Election Day.

ABSENTEE BALLOTS (EARLY VOTING)

Complete online: You must be a registered voter to request an absentee ballot. Visit the <https://myvote.wi.gov/> site for more information on how to register online and apply for an absentee ballot. Even though you may apply online, you must still provide proof of registration with your voter registration and photo ID with your absentee ballot request.

Request by mail: Download the Absentee Ballot Request Form (EL-121). Complete the form and mail it to the clerk's office. The application must be received by the clerk no later than 5 pm on the Thursday before the election in order for an absentee ballot to be mailed to you. A copy of your voter ID must be submitted with the absentee ballot request in order for the ballot to be mailed to you. http://elections.wi.gov/sites/default/files/gab_forms/4/el_121_application_for_absentee_ballot_2016_08_p_25916.pdf.

In-Person at the municipal clerk's office: Clerk's office absentee voting starts officially at 8 am on the third Monday prior to each election and ends at 5 pm on the Friday before the election. City Hall regular office hours are Mon-Fri 8 am through 4:30 pm. If ballots are available, you may vote earlier in the office of the Clerk by appointment or in office availability.

When voting in office, you do not need to fill out a form requesting the absentee ballot. No absentee ballots may be taken from the clerk's office to vote at home.

Deadline for returning ballot: The completed ballot must be received by 8 pm on election day in order for your ballot to be counted.

PROPERTY TAXES

Winnebago County property tax records are available online. Property information can be searched by parcel number, tax payer name, or property address. Paying your 2018 Real Estate Property Taxes in two installments? Please note: the 1st installment **was due by January 31, 2019** and accepted at Omro City Hall until the deadline date; the 2nd installment is **due on July 31, 2019** and payable to the Winnebago County Treasurer. The City of Omro cannot accept any payments for real estate taxes past the January 31st deadline. Second installment payments made by mail should be sent to: Winnebago County Treasurer, P.O. Box 2806, Oshkosh WI 54903-2806. If making your payment in person, please note the Winnebago County Treasurer's office has moved to: 112 Otter Ave, Oshkosh, WI 54901.

PET LICENSING

City of Omro Ordinance requires all dogs and cats be licensed each year by MARCH 31ST. The fee is \$10 for pets that are spayed or neutered and \$15 for pets that are not. If a license is not purchased by March 31st, there will be an additional \$5.00 late fee. Proof of rabies vaccination is required in order to obtain a dog or cat license. Your vet can provide you with a certificate of rabies, which has all the information we need to license your pet. If you no longer own the pet currently registered with the City, the pet is deceased, or you have moved outside of the Omro city limits, please notify City Hall at 685-7000 so we can update our records.

Water Conservation... it's everyone's Business

1. Run your clothes washer and dishwasher only when they are full. You can save up to 1,000 gallons a month.
2. For cold drinks keep a pitcher of water in the refrigerator instead of running the tap. This way, every drop goes down you and not the drain.
3. Monitor your water bill for unusually high use. Your bill and water meter are tools that can help you discover leaks.
4. Water your lawn and garden in the morning or evening when temperatures are cooler to minimize evaporation
5. Spreading a layer of organic mulch around plants retains moisture and saves water, time and money.
6. If your shower fills a one-gallon bucket in less than 20 seconds, replace the showerhead with a water-efficient model.

7. Adjust your lawn mower to a higher setting. A taller lawn shades roots and holds soil moisture better than if it is closely clipped.
8. When cleaning out fish tanks, give the nutrient-rich water to your plants.
9. Put food coloring in your toilet tank. If it seeps into the toilet bowl without flushing, you have a leak. Fixing it can save up to 1,000 gallons a month.
10. Aerate your lawn at least once a year so water can reach the roots rather than run off the surface.
11. If you accidentally drop ice cubes when filling your glass from the freezer, don't throw them in the sink. Drop them in a house plant instead.

Cooking Grease

The Omro wastewater department would like to remind residence that they should refrain from pouring cooking grease down the drain. While the grease is a liquid when warm, it becomes a solid when it cools and reaches your sanitary sewer and over time will accumulate and can cause a blockage in your lateral or the City's sewer main in the street. This could cause an expensive sewer back up for you or your neighbor and it's difficult to remove. Let your cooking grease cool and dispose of it in the trash

Weed and Grass Clippings

All grass clippings from lawn mowing or other sources are not allowed to blow onto, or accumulate on any public street in the City. Grass clippings can wash into storm sewer inlets

and affect drainage. All Omro residents are responsible for maintaining their lawns, grasses and noxious weeds to a length of no more than 8 inches. Lawns, grasses and noxious weeds exceeding 8 inches adversely affect public health and safety. These grasses and weeds emit pollen and other discomforting bits of plants, constitute fire and safety hazards, interfere with public convenience and adversely affect property values. **If you have already received a letter addressing the length of your grass, remember you will not receive another. If the City has to mow the lawn, you will be charged \$120.00 per hour for mowing. Any part of an hour will be charged as an hour. You will also receive a citation from the Police Department.**

Clean Landfill

Our clean landfill, Webster Landfill, will be accessible starting sometime in April, weather permitting. For your convenience, you may also stop by City Hall and check out a key Monday-Friday from 8am-3:30pm. All keys must be returned by closing and cannot be held overnight. There are a limited number of keys, so we ask that you have your yard waste loaded and ready to go to the landfill before you come and check out a key. All brush and grass items must be taken to Webster landfill. The Department of Natural Resources has encouraged us to have all material ground into mulch which is available to the general public at no cost. Rocks, dirt and concrete will still be taken to the landfill on Hwy 116. Remember: both landfills are for City Residents Only!

Clean Up Week

Each year the first full week of May is set-aside for City Wide Clean Up.

This year's cleanup will be May 6th thru May 11th. During this week only, Webster Landfill will be open from 9am – 6pm, Monday-Friday, as well as Saturday morning from 8 until noon, for City residents to dispose of their unwanted items. There will be no curbside pickup. Please take note of the following items which will not be accepted: Tires, batteries, oil, paint or any chemicals; white goods that contain Freon (such as, refrigerators, air conditioners or dehumidifiers); TV's microwaves and computer items.

Lead Issues with your Drinking Water

Why is lead a problem?

A: Although it has been used in numerous consumer products, lead is a toxic metal now known to be harmful to human health if inhaled or ingested. Important sources of lead exposure include: ambient air, soil and dust (both inside and outside the home), food (which can be contaminated by lead in the air or in food containers), and water (from the corrosion of plumbing). On average, it is estimated that lead in drinking water contributes between 10 and 20 percent of total lead exposure in young children. Federal controls on lead in gasoline have significantly reduced people's exposure to lead. The degree of harm depends upon the level of exposure (from all sources). Known effects of exposure to lead range from subtle biochemical changes at low levels of exposure, to severe neurological and toxic effects or even death at extremely high levels.

Does lead affect everyone equally?

A: Young children, infants and fetuses appear to be particularly vulnerable to lead poisoning. A dose of lead that would have little effect on an adult can have a big effect on a small body. Also, growing children will more rapidly absorb any lead they consume. A child's mental and physical development can be irreversibly stunted by over-exposure to lead. In infants, whose diet consists of liquids made with water - such as baby formula - lead in drinking water makes up an even greater proportion of total lead exposure (40 to 60 percent).

How could lead get into my drinking water?

A: Typically, lead gets into your water after the water leaves your local treatment plant or your well. That is, the source of lead in your home's water is most likely pipe or solder in your home's own plumbing. The most common cause is corrosion, a reaction between the water and the lead pipes or solder. Dissolved oxygen, low pH (acidity) and low mineral content in water are common causes of corrosion.

Does my home's age make a difference?

A: Lead-contaminated drinking water is most often a problem in houses that are either very old or very new. Up through the early 1900's, it was common practice, in some areas of the country, to use lead pipes for interior plumbing. Also, lead piping was often used for the service connections that join residences to public water supplies. (This practice ended only recently in some localities.) Plumbing installed before 1930 is most likely to contain lead. Copper pipes have replaced lead pipes in most residential plumbing. However, the use of lead solder with copper pipes is widespread. Experts regard this lead solder as the major cause of lead contamination of household water in U.S. homes today. New brass faucets and fittings can also leach lead, even though they are "lead-free." Scientific data indicate that the newer the home, the greater the risk of lead contamination. Lead levels decrease as a building ages. This is because, as time passes, mineral deposits form a coating on the inside of the pipes (if the water is not corrosive). This coating insulates the water from the solder. But, during the first five years (before the coating forms) water is in direct contact with the lead. More likely than not, water in buildings less than five years old has high levels of lead contamination.

How can I tell if my water contains too much lead?

A: You should have your water tested for lead. Testing costs between \$20 and \$100. Since you cannot see, taste, or smell lead dissolved in water, testing is the only sure way of telling whether or not there are harmful quantities of lead in your drinking water. You should be particularly suspicious if your home has lead pipes (lead is a dull gray metal that is soft enough to be easily scratched with a house key), if you see signs of corrosion frequent leaks,

rust-colored water, stained dishes or laundry, or if your non-plastic plumbing is less than five years old. Your water supplier may have useful information, including whether or not the service connector used in your home or area is made of lead. Testing is especially important in high-rise buildings where flushing might not work.

How do I have my water tested?

A: Water samples from the tap will have to be collected and sent to a qualified laboratory for analysis. Contact your water utility or your local health department for information and assistance. In some instances, these authorities will test your tap water for you, or they can refer you to a qualified laboratory. You may find a qualified testing company under "Laboratories" in the yellow pages of your telephone directory. You should be sure that the lab you use has been approved by your state or by EPA as being able to analyze drinking water samples for lead contamination. To find out which labs are qualified, contact your state or local department of the environment or health.

What is the government doing about the problem of lead in household water?

A: There are two major governmental actions to reduce your exposure to lead:
Under the authority of the Safe Drinking Water Act, EPA set the action level for lead in drinking water at 15 ppb. This means utilities must ensure that water from the customer's tap does not exceed this level in at least 90 percent of the homes sampled. If water from the tap does exceed this limit, then the utility must take certain steps to correct the problem. Utilities must also notify citizens of all violations of the standard.
In June 1986, President Reagan signed amendments to the Safe Drinking Water Act. These amendments require the use of "lead-free" pipe, solder, and flux in the installation or repair of any public water system, or any plumbing in a residential or non-residential facility connected to a public water system.



Class Order

Parent & Tot: (1-3 years old) Parents help child with swim basics and comfort in water

Pollywog: (3-4 years old) Swim basics and comfort in water, no parents in water

Jellyfish, Advanced Jellyfish: Start to the crawls, bobs and floating

Guppy, Advanced Guppy: Expand on crawls and floats, start on elementary backstroke, sidestroke

Starfish: Kick and crawl w/o support, elem. backstroke, expand sidestroke, start breaststroke

Advanced Starfish: Expand on endurance of crawls and kicks, further other strokes

Stingray: Expand on endurance: kick 100 yds, crawls 50 yds, other 25 yds, butterfly 10 yd

Barracuda: Details, flip turns, tread: crawls 100 yds, other 50 yds, butterfly 25 yds

Seals: Correct details, turns, endurance: crawls 200 yds, others 100 yds, butterfly 50 yds

Pre-Lifeguard (ses. 3 only): Cover lifeguard prerequisites, cover rescues and removals

Swimming Lesson Info

Class Fee: \$40 (Free with proof of Omro School District, see eligibility below)

Private lessons: \$60 for four half hour sessions, contact pool manager

Swimming Lessons Rules and Regulations

- There are three sessions of swimming lessons. Each runs Monday through Thursday for three weeks and is 40 minutes a day.
- Parents may sign up for one session at a time, and must finish a session before signing up for another session.
- Class limits will be followed, no exceptions.
- Parents are allowed on the deck but not in the water, except Parent Tot.
- Swim lessons may be cancelled due to weather, even fun days, and will not be rescheduled. Call OFAC or check Facebook for cancellations.

School District Eligibility

- Any student enrolled or able to be enrolled in the Omro School District system is eligible for free swim lessons.

Including:

- Students currently enrolled in 4K, but not yet started in 4K
- Students open enrolled in another district, yet live within the Omro School District
- Students who are home schooled and live within the Omro School District
- To receive free swim lessons, provide proof of enrollment is required at time of registration (report card, letter or another document from district).

 - * NO water shooting entries, including high-powered water guns, super shooters, water balloons, or buckets.
 - *NO throwing candy from floats or vehicles. A representative may walk alongside the entry to distribute candy, thereby avoiding the danger resulting from children running into the street to retrieve it.
 - *All animal entries **must** clean up all animal droppings before leaving the city.
 - *All fire departments are limited to 3 theme decorated vehicles.
 - *All clubs are limited to 6 vehicles and must be decorated according to theme. Vehicles must line-up 2 by 2 and proceed through the parade as such.
 - *Privately owned vehicles, not pulling parade theme floats, are not allowed in the parade, with the exception of antique vehicles.
